

## MRS. J. EDWARD STIER.


Mrs. J. Edward Stier, nee Estella L. DeFalco, was the daughter of George R. and the late Ella A. DeFalco (nee McDermott). She was born in Baltimore and was educated in a private school. In 1905 she was married to J. Edward Stier, son of Winfield Scott Stier and the late Sophia C. Boteler Stier.

Mrs. Stier has been active in civic organizations and has frequently appeared before the Legislature and City Council on matters pertaining to civic welfare. She was one of the organizers of the Housewives Alliance. For one year she served as vice-president, and then was elected to the office of president. For six years she served in this capacity. The Housewives Alliance, a civic organization of Baltimore, is affiliated with the National Council of Women.

Mrs. Stier held the offices of secretary and vice-president, respectively, of the Charles W. Galloway Auxiliary to the Baltimore and Ohio Veteran Employees' Association. In 1926 she was elected president. Later she became grand treasurer of this organization, which includes 27 auxiliary associations. In 1929 she was elected grand secretary.

Under the administration of Mrs. George A. Golder, Mrs. Stier served on the executive board of the Twentieth Century Club, and represented the club at the convention of the Federation of Women's Clubs at Salisbury, Maryland, in June, 1930. She is a director of the Middleborough Roads and Maintenance Corporation, and was elected secretary to this organization in 1928. Mrs. Stier has the distinction of being the only woman member of this board. She was sent as a delegate to the Biennial Convention of the National Council of Women, in New York in 1928. She is a member of the National Women's Party, of the Flag House Association, of the Pilgrims of St. Marys, and of the Women of Mooseheart Legion.
